Directions: Find 10 different colors to represent the 10 different plagues, color the number of days the plague would have lasted given the minimum days the Bible speaks of per plague. Assume no “non-plague” days between plagues unless specified in the Bible (i.e. “the next day...”, “Tomorrow” both denote that the plague would have started the next day and those would notate a “non-plague” day). More than likely, the plagues which do not have a specific time period associated with them would have lasted longer with little “relief” between them to have the “desired” effect on the Pharaoh/Egypt, but even with the minimum number of days, it still would have been devastating to the Egyptian people. Hint: Count up the days for each plague, then work backwards on the chart. You will be able to see when they may have started.
